UWM ALUMNI DAY At the April meeting Mr. Victor Muth, Director of Eng., AC Electronics Division, invited the members of our society to attend UWM'S 1969 Alumni Day on April 26 in UWM'S Union Fireside Lounge, and it turned out to be a very pleasant, informative day indeed. The program's theme was "The Moon and Beyond". Mr. Robert Thompson, Director of the Lovell Space Center in Milwaukee spoke about space travel simulation, a prime feature of the

proposed center, Mr. Lawrence Delaney of AC Electronics Div. told how space craft guidance is accomplished by very precise gyros, and MAS member Harry Pease of The Milwaukee Journal related how a rocket program lifted an entire community to a much better standard of living. Two highlights of the program were a Disney Film "Mars and Beyond" and a full length picture "Destination Moon". Following the dinner were addresses by distinguished speakers and a short NASA film about the Apollo 8 Flight - "Go For TLI" - showing the moon from orbital flight 60 miles above the surface.

NCRAL CONVENTION The North Central Region Astronomical League's 23rd Annual Convention was held May 3 at Racine. After league Pres. William DuVall made his opening remarks about the amateur's role in the space age, papers were read by members of the societies making up the League. They included notes on solar telescopes, astro-photagraphy, the Pleides occultation, variable stars, ideas on the 43 stars within 16 light years of our sun, changes in Jupiter, as well as papers by Mr. William Albrecht on Tektites and MAS Director Edward Halbach on the 1970 Solar Eclipse. The late afternoon found everyone at the unusual Johnson Wax Golden Rondelle where they viewed the films "Exploring the Milky Way" and "To Be Alive". The banquet speech was given by Dr. W. Markowitz of Marquette University whose thought-provoking subject was on the satellites of Mars. The busy day was concluded by trips to the Gifford Jr. High Planetarium and the Modine-Benstead Planetarium. A word of appreciation is in order here for the many people who did such a great job on the flawless program.
